



FREDERICK B. WHITTEMORE HONORED AT THE 209TH ANNUAL DINNER DANCE

On Friday, November 14, the Society honored Frederick B. Whittemore at the 209th Annual Dinner Dance at the Metropolitan Club. He was bestowed with the Reginald T. Townsend Award for his significant support of higher education and conservation in New England. The awards presentation included a video from the Watch Hill Conservancy, where he is a founding member, president and chairman. Founded in 1999, the Conservancy has the broad mission of conserving Napatree Point and the natural environment of Watch Hill. As

Mr. Whittemore graciously accepted his Townsend award, he read a poem that he had written for the occasion. The insightful poem has been reproduced in its entirety on page 2.

In addition to his work with the Watch Hill Conservancy, Mr. Whittemore is also a founding trustee of the Weekapaug Foundation for Conservation, a nonprofit land trust dedicated to preserving and protecting open space and clean water. He is also a longtime supporter of higher education. He serves on the boards of Dartmouth College's Tuck School of Business Administration and the University of New Hampshire's Whittemore School of Business Administration.

Scott was recognized for his tireless efforts on behalf of the Society as president in 2009 and 2010, and for his continued support of our philanthropic mission and our scholars. His ongoing advice and counsel in his emeritus role merit high praise.

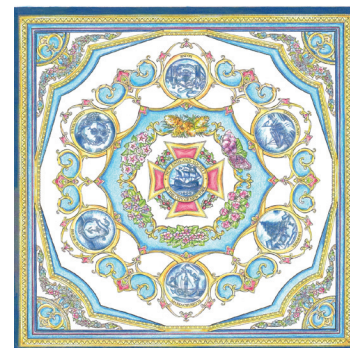
